The Arts & Sciences IV Collection includes an exceptional group of business titles, with twenty-six journals from JSTOR Business collections that are not available in any other Arts & Sciences collection. This group contains a strong cluster of management journals, with influential titles such as the *Academy of Management Journal* and the *Academy of Management Review*. Interdisciplinary business journals such as *Administrative Science Quarterly* expand the breadth of this discipline. Journals cover subdisciplines such as operations management, marketing, and accounting, including the *Accounting Review*.

The collection contains a diverse group of journals serving both scholars and practitioners in the field of public policy and administration. Major titles include the *Milbank Quarterly*, covering population health and health policy, and the *Public Administration Review*, published by the American Society for Public Administration and covering administration research, theory, and practice for more than sixty years.

With the largest group of law titles in any Arts & Sciences collection, titles in this set cover an outstanding range of legal scholarship. The collection contains law journals with more than 100 years in publication, such as the *Harvard Law Review*, founded in 1887, and the *University of Pennsylvania Law Review*, the oldest law journal in the United States, published continuously for more than 160 years. The depth of legal studies coverage is broadened by interdisciplinary journals such as *Human Rights Quarterly*, a principal resource on the subject of human rights, and the *Law & Society Review*, uniting law, politics, and sociology.

The collection includes important titles in education and psychology, including *Child Development*, published by the Society for Research in Child Development, and *American Journal of Psychology*, founded in 1887. Other noteworthy education titles include the *English Journal*, published by the National Council of Teachers of English, and the *Elementary School Journal*, with more than 100 years in print.

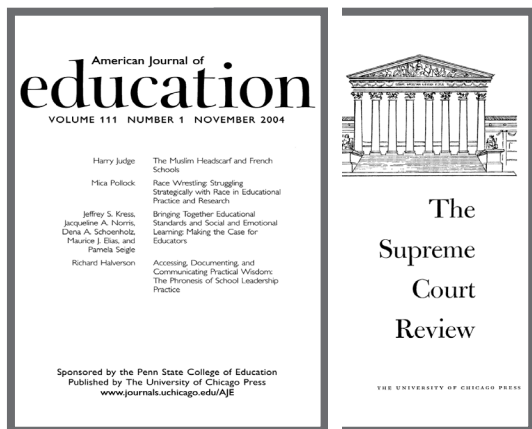

Enhanced discovery & usability

More content formats Historical content is available as full-color or gray-scale page scans, creating a more faithful replication of the original printed page. Current issues are available as PDFs and full-text HTML. Multimedia files, including audio and video, are also available for some titles.

Reference linking JSTOR includes thousands of reference links that enable users to move from citations within articles to other articles in JSTOR.

Forward linking From a sidebar on article view pages, users can link to articles in JSTOR or Google Scholar™ that cite the current article, and to related articles in Google Scholar™.

Seamless access to current and historical content For a growing subset of titles, users are able to search and browse beyond the moving wall, retrieving links to the full-text of the most recent journal issues at the publisher's website.

Searching on A&I databases JSTOR has partnered with several abstract and indexing databases to provide article-level linking to JSTOR for participating institutions. Partners include ABC-CLIO's Historical Abstracts, EBSCOhost, Elsevier (SCOPUS), and Thomson ISI.

Personalization with MyJSTOR Users can save searches and citations, and can opt in to receive email alerts when new content matches their saved search terms.
